Greenblatt Inducted into STL Sports Hall of Fame

St. Louis Press Club President William Greenblatt was enshrined into the St. Louis Sports Hall of Fame September 15, 2017, being recognized for his body of work in sports photography. He was one of 16 new inductees.

“I don’t know how I got it,” Greenblatt said. “It’s a little humbling.”

As a staff photographer for UPI wire service, Greenblatt photographs the Cardinals, Blues, Mizzou football and basketball in addition to news making events throughout the state. As the owner of William Greenblatt Photography, LLC, Greenblatt is the official photographer for the St. Louis Fire Department, Mayor Lyda Krewson plus over 20 commercial accounts. Greenblatt has been the official photographer for the last five Missouri Governors. A member of the Press Club since 1984 Greenblatt became a member of the board in 1995.

His interest in photography started in seventh grade when his English teacher handed him a Polaroid camera to take photos for the school newspaper and yearbook. In his senior year of high school, while working at a camera store in Clayton, he met Fred Sweets, a photographer for the St. Louis Post-Dispatch, who encouraged his interest in photography.

Greenblatt has an undergraduate degree from the University of Missouri-Columbia, where he studied English, music, and linguistics with graduate studies in photojournalism.

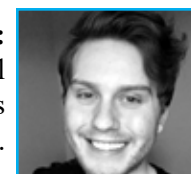
West End Word/Webster University Foundation Scholarship (\$1,000):

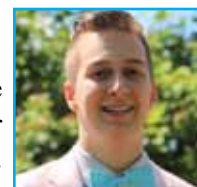
Press Club's "Sky's the Limit" Scholarship (\$1,000):

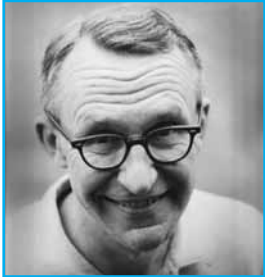
Press Club's Missouri Journalism Educators High School Student Journalist of the Year (\$1,000):
