

The recent tragic death of a local 13-year-old victim of cyber bullying has had national and international reverberations. Legislators, educators, parents and the legal community continue to examine ways to prevent this abuse while considering First Amendment rights. The Press Club is proud to sponsor a forum on this critically important issue in collaboration with Jewish Family and Children's Service (JF&CS) and the Holocaust Museum and Learning Center, a department of the Jewish Federation of St. Louis, and the Anti-Defamation League (ADL).
